Tax Information for Aboriginal Peoples

Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) provides information to Aboriginal entrepreneurs regarding the tax benefits and requirements that apply to them. Aboriginal people are subject to the same tax rules as other Canadian residents unless their income is eligible for the tax exemption under section 87 of the Indian Act.
